Hello to all and a Happy 2018 New Year! Sensei Dods kindly asked if I wouldn't mind being featured in the FOCUS newsletter, so here is something from me.

I am Sensei André Beauregard, 5th Dan and chief instructor at André's Budo Centre in Edmonton, Alberta. I am originally from Montreal, Quebec and have been living in Edmonton since April 9th, 1988. I have been married to my wife Helen for more than 22 years and have two dogs, Sophie and Cherie. My passion for the martial arts started the

moment I saw Bruce Lee's movie "The Chinese Connection" in the early 1970s. My karate journey officially started in Montreal in Kyokushinkai karate, from November 1985 to April 1988, and I was a green belt when I left that karate club. My teachers at the time were Shihan André Gilbert (6th Dan) and Sensei Alain Bonamie, 3rd Dan. In 1988, my career took me to Edmonton where I was hired as a technical translator for an aerospace company that produced technical publications for Canada's National Defence.

In January 1989, I transitioned to Wado-Kai Karate at the Edmonton Westmount YMCA, and my teacher was Sensei Randy James, 2nd Dan. I was a Shodan-ho when I started my first karate program at J. H. Picard School in 1992, and in

February 1993, Sensei Manara awarded me my Shodan rank. From that moment, I went on to develop six other



after-school karate programs in the French and French Immersion schools of Edmonton. My other ranks followed in 1995, 1998, 2004 and 2010. Sensei James was my instructor until my 2nd Dan. I am grateful for all the years of training under his tutelage. My full-time job as a translator and my involvement with the karate after-school programs has kept me very busy over the years, and still do. In 1995, it was time for me to fly solo and discover what kind of karate instructor I could become.



In 2004, I had the opportunity to train at a Yudansha class at the Ryerson club; and that same year, Sensei James and I attended the Wasaga Beach Summer Training Camp. It is there that we both received the Shintani Award. In Alberta, I also had the opportunity to work out with the Alberta Shintani Wado-Kai Karate group. It is at one of their tournaments that I met a great karate-ka, Sensei Ed Young (4th Dan at that time, which was 25 years ago)! We both teach together at one the karate after-school programs.

Over the years, I had the opportunity to train with great TWKK sensei. Among them, of course, Sensei Dave Manara, Randy James, Michael McCarthy, Eric Bergman, Ian Mador, Steve Henrich and Steve Borda. I am grateful for their shared knowledge and feedback. I also have trained in Aikibudo with Sensei Pascal Morrissette.

In November 2010, Sensei Manara awarded me my 5th Dan. In 2012, I founded André's Budo Centre Inc., which became my official dojo. Since 1995, I have been fortunate to train 22 students to the black belt level (five of them made it to Nidan) plus two red belts, so far. In 2006, I joined the RCMP Auxiliary Program and was awarded in 2012 the Queen Elizabeth Jubilee Medal for the many safety talks I have given in the elementary and high schools in Edmonton.

I hope to be able to teach karate for many more years. Looking back, it is not hard for me to believe that it has already been 32 years.


2017 TWKK AWARDS DINNER



I have assembled information to serve as a documentation of our history to-date in observance of our 50-year milestone accomplishment.

We are considering a more formal series of celebratory activities. Excerpts of this, included here, provide what can be viewed as our first in a possible series of efforts.

The continued relationships forged with TWKK is expected to be continued, and the assistance and guidance of President and Sensei Dave and a literal host of Senior students are recognized, and acknowledged.





Bahamas Caribbean Aikiwa Karate Clubs, Grand Bahama, Bahamas

Note: The following represents excerpts from Sensei Freeman's documentation entitled "My Karate Journey – 1967-2017: 50 Years of Wado Kai Karate".

In 1967, I first visited Toronto, Canada, on a fact-finding tour - Ryerson University campus (then Ryerson Polytechnical Institute). At the time I was a high school 1967 graduate, and while working as a Cadet at the Main Dispensary of our flag-ship Government Princess Margaret Hospital, Nassau, Bahamas, I was looking to further my education for a possible career in Pharmacology. My family could not afford sending me to College, but I came to Canada to check on Colleges, anyways.

I applied in 1970/71 on the basis of an academic scholarship, but actually started courses at the Institute in the 1974/5 school year in the Chemical Technology Degree program.

I was married in 1970 to Annamae, and we had two small children a toddler son and a babe-in-arms daughter. When I left home for College in 1974, I did not bring my family. I wanted to 'see' Canada, 'up close', first. Roaming around Ryerson campus by myself, particularly around the basketball courts/multi-purpose courts, and pool levels, I came upon a notice for karate classes posted at the lower basement gym. Curiosity got the better of me, so I attended a 'signing-up' / demo session, met a steely-eyed young Instructor, David Manara, (and eventually other youthful senior students like Ray Kennedy and Jerry McPherson), and signed up for formal Wado-Kai Karate instruction. And the rest is History!



My family joined me in Canada shortly thereafter, and (now Sensei) Annamae soon started her training at Ryerson, too. The kids became the 'darling toddlers' of the class. And, Yes, we had made friendships that have endured to this day. I graduated from the Ryerson three-year Diploma Program in 1977. After a full-time employment stint as a Research Assistant at Canadian Industries Research Laboratories (CIL), Toronto, in 1978, I returned to Ryerson for the five-year Degree Program in Chemical Technology – Applied Option. Significantly, I had a job waiting back home when I graduated at Syntex Pharmaceuticals International, the company that contributed to my scholarship extensions for my Degree Program, and where I had worked 1971 -1974 in Research/Process development Laboratories, before I decided to come to Canada to further education at Ryerson.



I subsequently spent, in total, some 15 years (or so) in Pharmaceuticals (Steroids) and Fine Chemicals Laboratory Research and Development, and related Manufacturing Plant & Industrial Waste – Treatment/Environmental Systems Management. My job, and Civic activities (Kiwanis International officer, Bahamas & Caribbean District – 1985 -1996) required much Caribbean and International travels, which was excellent for me, and accounts for the growth of AIKIWA Wado-Kai Karate in this region. This provided many contributions to my personal experiences, growth, and development in martial arts training, as well. 'Have Karate-gi, will travel' was stamped on my TWKK GI Bag, which my wife, Annamae, always packed first when she's herding me off to some strange destination, again. (Yes, I still have an old gi-bag. All beat-up – an eye-sore, really, but a nostalgia item all the same)!

Some 40 years ago, the Bahamas Wado-Kai (founded 1973/4) offered a summer training program at the Freeport, Grand Bahama, YMCA. Simply referred to as 'YMCA Karate Club', it was the forerunner of Bahamas Wado-Kai/Bahamas and Caribbean AlKIWA Wado-kai Karate – Kubudo) that primarily catered to under-privileged, inner-city youth and young adults. The primary objective of this program was to fill in the usually boring, mischief-prone, long hot days after the euphoria of school closings wears off, and dull, nothing-to-do reality takes root in most of our youth.

The program was originally seen to be a very limited, essentially a one-off "special", as there were no plans for the karate sessions expansion, beyond the initial summer offerings.

Fate intervened, however. Bowing to public demand and support, the program was modified and offered in the Fall/Winter as a regular YMCA program. It then took on a life of its own when Community Centre programs were organized in the Spring for urban youths at various island Civic Centres, including the then newly opened Eight Mile Rock settlement YMCA facilities.

Over the ensuing 40 years, the programs expanded greatly to include primary and secondary schools. Young adults classes were organized, and a vibrant adult training program flourished. That is, programs for the whole family. The programs, offered initially 'free-of-charge' to all (i.e., subsidized by Sensei Freeman Thurston), are now supported by special funding by the Bahamas Government via Freeport, Grand Bahama, Local Government Council, and Corporate Friends-of-Bahamas Wado-Kai occasional grants.

Technical, and managerial support, and encouragement, were sought from the Toronto Wado-Kai Karate organization provided by Sensei Dave, personally, and via a 'rash' of visiting TWKK Senior Belts in the first 20 years, or so. Included were Sensei Robb Dods, Rob Stark, Blaine Beemer, Eric Goddard, and Steve Borda. A delegation of TWKK students and senior persons came to train with us in Freeport in 1992; our tireless Sensei Robb Dods gets the lion's share of credit for making that trip happen. Our Bahamamamas did one better in 2010, with the Bahamas 2010, and what an enormous success that undertaking turned out to be!

From those early, very challenging days, the life-blood of AIKIWA Wado-Kai Karate development in the Bahamas, and by extension, the Caribbean Region as a whole to this date, has been our close, family relationships with Sensei Dave and the entire TWKK organization. Cultivated and nurtured over the decades; therein lies our Harmony, our Strength.


