December 4th Seikikai Yudansha By Sensei Steve Borda 8th Dan

We had a good turnout to the December Yudansha at the Etobicoke Olympium. Sensei **Steve Borda** presented Bunkai (analysis of kata sequences) and Oyo (practical applications from kata) from sequences in Naifunchi Sandan, Wansu, Bassai Dai, and Itosu Rohai. Sensei **Michael McCarthy** presented the strategic differences of Go No Sen (reactive defense, i.e., block then counter), Sen No Sen (simultaneous block and counter), and Sen Sen No Sen (preemptive attack).







Training with students from other clubs has a net benefit to the Karate-ka. Sometimes, when training only with members of our own club we get a little complacent. We are familiar with the other students and have learned their particular methods of Kumite and Kihon Kumite. When you partner up with someone less familiar to you it forces you to think. Thinking is required for all training levels of Karate-ka. I encourage everyone to take advantage of any additional training opportunities that come your way.

One of the things that I think is an important principle, particularly for our Yudansha, is the concept of "Continuous Improvement". As Yudansha we have to look at how we can always get better, whether it is physical (i.e., speed, power, form, etc.) or by improving our knowledge base. We have to challenge ourselves to improve.

How do We Score Kata and Kumite at Tournaments

There are a few varieties of methods to score participants in martial art events, but the judging is consistent in the methodology at the TWKK Tournaments.

For Kata, when we have five judges raising their scores, these are all recorded. To determine the winners, the highest and lowest scores for each contestant are struck off and the highest sum of the middle scores determines the winners. If there is a tie for a place, the highest and lowest scores are added back for the tied contestants (the higher score wins). If there is still a tie, (or if there are only three judges' scores, not five) the contestants are asked to do their kata again. This time the judges make a choice through consensus, a 3 to 2 (or 2 to 1) determination of the better performed kata.

For Kumite (sparring), the chart below shows how the number of matches is determined. The first elimination rounds are to sort out the odd number of people and this is where a "Bye" is used, referring to a competitor automatically advancing to the next round of tournament play without competing. The Bye is used to result in matches of multiples of four (4, 8, 16). A person gets a Bye when they do not have an opponent for their first match, and they automatically move up to the next round.

When there are only three participants, one person would be given a Bye and the other two would spar. The winner of the second match would spar with the Bye for first and second place.

A "round robin" approach for three people provides more opportunity for the participants to spar. Two people engage, the winner spars with the 3rd person. The winner for the second match then spars with the loser from the first match; the loser of that match will get 3rd place, the other two then spar for first and second place.

For scoring, at least three judges of the five must call a point scored. First competitor to score two points within two minutes wins the match. At the end of two minutes and the score is tied (no score or 1:1) the first opponent to score a point in a one minute round wins. If there is then no score, the centre judge will ask the judges to turn their backs to the centre of the ring and raise a hand signifying who they feel was the player with the stronger performance; the centre judge breaks a tie.

If the competitors have more than a belt rank difference between them (i.e., white against orange or higher) the lower rank can win scoring one point, while the higher rank must score two points to win.
