Remembering Sensei Jim Sullivan, Godan

On April 24, 2023, our TWKK community once again felt the loss of a friend and long time supporter, Sensei Jim Sullivan. Jim and Margaret Michael were Nidans in 1996 when they started the Clarington club in Bowmanville, along with Sensei Steve Swain. In 2004, Marg and Jim began classes in the Pembroke area, calling the dojo Laurentian Valley Wado-Kai Karate. Following Marg and Jim, the Clarington club passed to Sensei Margaret Sheyan, then to Sensei Vanessa Connors (currently under Sensei Robin Singh). Vanessa has moved to Alberta, but still receives FOCUS, and she offered to provide her memories of Sensei Jim.



My introduction to Sensei Jim took place in the summer of 1998. With a three year old toddler and four month old baby at home, this exhausted mother was looking for an outlet to meet other adults, as well as burn off some built up steam that comes with the mayhem of family life.

Walking into a dojo can be extremely intimidating, but when the first face to greet me at the entrance had a mischievous smile and sparkling blue eyes, I knew I was in the right place. Sensei Jim, Margaret, Barry and Marg were so welcoming, patient and knowledgeable, and I couldn't help to not only attempt to glean as much karate knowledge as I could from them, but to also become friends with them.

Sensei Jim was very patient with me as he would explain a technique, then demonstrate (and then demonstrate again), all with that genuine, boyish smile. I always felt that it took a special kind of patience to be able to teach both children and adults, and Sensei Jim was gifted with the ability to be able to connect with all ages of students.

Of all the stories and discussions that Sensei Jim and I had, two stand out in my mind. The first one involves him living on a farm, with barn cats and wood chippers, and is not one for the faint of heart. To this day, I have never been able to determine if he was just pulling my leg 'Jim Sullivan style', or if it was a true story. But that was Sensei Jim, and the laughing and mischievous grin made me feel that he was joking with me because he knew he'd get a reaction. I really do hope he was joking!!

The second and far more important story is an abbreviated version of how he felt when he met Sensei Margaret. I was struck then, and am still quite moved, by Sensei Jim's telling of how he felt about the love of his life. It is a rare thing to hear such adoration in a man's voice when he speaks of his life partner, and it spoke volumes of his love and respect

for Sensei Margaret. All of the adults in the dojo who became friends with all our sensei, knew how he felt about her.

Sensei Jim was a teacher, a student, a colleague but, most importantly, he was my friend.

Thank you, Sensei Jim, for the benefit of your knowledge, and for sharing a part of you with us. You are much loved, well respected, and will be greatly missed.

Annual Training Camp Hosted by Seikikai Karate Club

As advertised via email to the Ontario black belt karate-ka, the annual training camp is being held at the Borda Ranch in Caledon on Saturday, July 8, 2023. This year we are trying a new format.

Children 6-8 have one session from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm.

Children 9-12 have two sessions. The first is from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm, the second session is from 1:15 pm to 2:15 pm.

Teens and adults have four sessions. The morning sessions are from 9:50 am to 10:50 am and from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm. The afternoon sessions are from 1:15 pm to 2:15 pm and from 2:25 pm to 3:25 pm.

Athlete of the Year Awards 2022 – 2023 Season

We will be presenting **Athlete of the Year** awards at the Training Camp in July. There will be one award for each age group division. There will also be an award in the Black Belt Division.

For the three tournaments we held during the 2022-2023 season, the competitors were awarded 3 points for first place, 2 points for second place and 1 point for third place. The person with the highest point rating will get an award. In the case where a competitor has had a birthday that moves them into a different age group during the season, the competitor will be placed in the age category that they were in for the majority of the season. For example, if a competitor was in one age group for the first tournament, but in an older age group for the other two tournaments, then the competitor would be assessed in the older age group. If a competitor would be assessed in the younger age group.

We had a tie for the Ages 6-8 Category, so we will be presenting two awards for that category. The awards will be present to

Reprise: Sensei Margaret Michael, Godan and Sensei Jim Sullivan, Godan

Sensei Marg and Jim represent the qualities associated with the Toronto Wado-Kai and the Shintani Award – Sincerity, Dedication and, most especially, Humility; so much so that I was hard-pressed to lure their story for our readers to learn more about this steadfast karate couple. Sensei Marg was the recipient of the Shintani Award in 2002 and Sensei Jim in 2010. Marg and Jim began taking karate because it was something they had wanted to do and the Oshawa club was close by. Jim began his training at the age of 48; he had just retired and was looking or something interesting to do. Marg was 35 when she began training. When asked about any career changes during her training years, Marg replied, "I was a clerk at General Motors of Canada in the GM10 Pilot program; then I retired from G.M. in 2002."

Their first impressions of the Oshawa dojo were that it was 'easy going' with 'friendly people'. Sensei Jose-Carlos Garcia was the head instructor at the Oshawa-Whitby Wado-Kai, but Marg remembers that there were 26 white belts that joined at that time, and it was Sensei Ron Sheyan and Sharon Imeson that trained the beginner group. Both Marg and Jim trained to their black belt before branching out.

"We were Nidans in 1996 when we started the Clarington club in Bowmanville along with Steve Swain," said Marg. Years later, Marg and Jim began classes in the Pembroke area in January 2004.

Asked about what they thought as their achievements and highlights of their time in karate, Jim said "sharing with others" and "[he] stayed in shape". Marg noted, "Starting up three dojos, so we could pass along what we were taught; and sharing our knowledge with hundreds of students that we trained."

Sensei Weldon Zabizewski said, "When they turned over the dojo to Sensei Marg Sheyan and me, they left us with a well-run club, and we used the teachings from both Jim and Marg to continue running the Clarington dojo in their spirit."

"We still visited with our first instructors Ron and Sharon along with many of the other people that we have met during our years of training," said Marg. "Some come up to Pembroke to visit and/or do a class with us, like Ron from Brooklin-Whitby, Frank and Jan from Port Perry, and Larry from Mississauga. We even have former students come visit from the Oshawa and Clarington Clubs. Steve and his wife, Theresa, come up to visit every year to catch [us] up on the news in Oshawa."

Sensei Marg and Jim have continued over the years to support and participate in the annual Training Camp. Jim can often be seen in pictures of the Camps, working out with his fellow karate-kas. Many will know Marg with a camera in hand, capturing the history of the Camps; many, if not most, of the pictures in the TWKK Flickr albums of the past Camps are of Marg's diligent photography. (It was hard to find pictures of Marg since she was the one taking them). Maybe we should recruit Marg as the Camp Historian.
