## How Long Have You Been With The TWKK?

The Toronto Wado-Kai Karate Club began in 1971 at Ryerson Polytechnical Institute, now called Toronto Metropolitan University. That is now 52 years since Sensei Manara, 9<sup>th</sup> Dan, founder of the TWKK, 'opened the doors' to an institution that has become a multi-generational community experience in the martial arts. Many karate-ka of the TWKK have been members since they first began their training. Others have left, of course, and some came back after time away; and some have brought their children, and even their children's children to the TWKK dojos for martial arts training.

What this means is that there are members that have now been involved with the TWKK for 50 years, such as Sensei Ray Kennedy, whom we noted in last year's October FOCUS. There are members who, over this decade, will reach 50 years of training, if not congruently, and membership with the organisation.

We have been considering how we might celebrate this. Getting together to acknowledge those who have contributed over the years with steadfast support, and those who have had a long-term relationship, not to mention all the karate friends and acquaintances made over the years, seems like the appropriate thing to do. Rather than having multiple recognition events, we have been thinking about one affair to acknowledge everyone who would reach the 50<sup>th</sup> year milestone in the 2020's.

Greetings from the Brooklin Club. We have been busy the past few months training through the heat of summer and now, leading into the fall, with many of our students successfully grading to their next belt levels.


