An advantage to registering early is that for Kumite (free sparring) we sometimes have to award a "bye" (the transfer of a competitor directly to the next round of the competition) to some competitors at the start of the competition, in order to get the group to a size where we can have a set of straight elimination rounds. If you get a "bye" it's like winning your first sparring match without sparring. If needed, byes will be awarded to the competitors registered in the group in the order of when they registered.

We always need judges. There is a section in the registration on-line for judges to register as well. Judges, please arrive at 1:30 for a Judges meeting prior to the tournament.

Many Memories – Great Experiences!

More shared memories from another alumnus of the organisation who trained at Ryerson in years past.

Sensei John Gallaugher

The Ryerson Club was a great place back in the '70s. In those days, the Lower Gym was our "home" Mondays and Wednesdays in the evenings, and Saturday mornings. We would get shuttled over to Ryerson Hall when exams were on and who could EVER forget that hard concrete tiled floor that seemed mostly frozen during the winter months.

One funny memory, that I may have written about before, warrants another mention though. During a Saturday morning, the Ryerson final exams were on and we are up there in The Hall training, punching and kicking away. A young guy who was just walking through the Ryerson facility, noticed all of our gym bags and shoes in a pile; and for whatever reason this "brainiac" decides to lift one of the girls purses and run off!!!

I forget who yelled about it, but we all turned around just in time to witness him running down the Hallway, headed for the stairs. Who knows what the general public thought at that time, but that Saturday morning one very stupid young guy was being chased across Gerrard Street and down Yonge Street by an ENTIRE KARATE CLUB screaming at him. These were the days before every single person had a camera in their hands so there are probably no visual records of the event, but we did, in fact, catch him when he made the fatal mistake of turning into a dead end alleyway with no escape. You can only imagine the shocked look on his face when he turned around and the entire Karate Club was standing there. Thankfully, it was one of those really nice spring days in Toronto and we all enjoyed the walk back with purse in hand.

Another funny moment comes to me about a certain class where we were paired together with a partner to do some punching drills. Sensei had us facing each other and the idea was to have enough distance between us so we could execute a proper punch without actually hitting each other's fists together.

Steve Borda and I partnered-up; we set our distance, slowly punched into the middle section to check our focus, backed up a bit so as not to hit fists and the drill began. On ONE ... you guessed it ... Steve and I smashed our middle knuckles together at the perfect moment! YEOWCH!!!–BIG TIME!!! Right after Sensei had just finished telling us about having the proper distance NOT to hit our fists together! HAHAHAAA! I believe Steve and I had a pair of "golf ball" sized red knuckles for a couple weeks!



We also had quite a bit of fun in those days at the annual Christmas Party. One year a couple of "special guests" showed up ... KARATE CLAUSE AND THE UNKNOWN ELF!!! There was quite a loud roar of laughter as I recall and it got even louder as these "special guests" passed out a host of satirical Christmas gag gifts to various members before quickly departing and returning to "parts unknown" from whence they came.

Some of us also found humour with a particular character in the hall. In our regular "home" of the lower gym, the temperature could get fairly hot, so we often had all the doors open onto the hallway. Sometimes, this funny, elderly "street person" would find his way down wandering around, usually after he'd ingested his "daily bottle". And he would stand near the back doors yelling "arrgghh, arrgghh, arrgghh" trying to imitate the class [Kaia's] as we were going through our punching and kicking drills. He was totally harmless, but it was kind of funny as his timing was way off which made the yelling even funnier.

There are also lots of fun memories from the Summer Camps at The Ryerson Farm, Rice Lake and Wasaga Beach and a lifetime of other memories at the original Ryerson Club.



It was a different time and we had different values back then, but the old core group who showed up day after day for years became pretty accomplished Black Belts and, to this day, quite a number of us are still pretty good friends. We have Sensei Manara to thank for that. It takes a special person with a lifetime of commitment and dedication to create a community like that and keep it growing strong after over 60 years.




OUR CONDOLENCES

We are very happy to announce that **Nelly Readner** (87 years young) was ranked to Shodan this summer.


